MONTHLY MOTIVATION

STANDING STRONG IN ADVERSITY

Life has a way of reminding us that no one is immune to adversity. Regardless of our accomplishments, titles, careers, or affiliations, we all experience seasons of uncertainty. We encounter unexpected losses, health challenges, financial pressures, disappointments, broken relationships, and moments when the future seems unclear. During those times, it is easy to become discouraged or wonder if we have the strength to continue.

Yet for people of faith, adversity is never the final chapter. It is often the place where God does His greatest work in us.

As members of the Divine Nine, we celebrate a rich legacy of scholarship, service, leadership, and perseverance. The founders of our fraternities and sororities overcame tremendous obstacles while pursuing excellence and creating opportunities for generations to come. They understood that perseverance is not simply about enduring hardship—it is about remaining committed to a purpose greater than oneself.

Scripture reminds us that our greatest source of strength does not come from our own abilities but from God.

The prophet Isaiah offers these comforting words:

“So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.”
— Isaiah 41:10 (NIV)

Notice that God does not promise a life free from difficulties. Instead, He promises His presence. He promises strength when we feel weak, courage when we feel afraid, and support when we feel overwhelmed. His promise is not that we will avoid every storm, but that we will never walk through the storm alone.

The Apostle Paul echoes this assurance in his letter to the Romans:

“And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.”
— Romans 8:28 (NIV)

This verse does not suggest that every situation is good. Pain is real. Loss is real. Struggle is real. But God has the power to bring good even out of difficult circumstances. He can turn setbacks into lessons, trials into testimonies, and adversity into opportunities for growth and transformation.

Many of us can look back over our lives and recognize moments when we thought we would not make it through. Yet somehow, God provided strength for another day, wisdom for another decision, and hope for another season. What seemed impossible at the time became evidence of His faithfulness.

In challenging times, faith becomes more than a belief—it becomes an anchor. Faith reminds us that our current struggle is not our permanent destination. It encourages us to keep serving, keep leading, keep mentoring, and keep lifting others even while we are walking through our own battles.

The Divine Nine has always represented resilience, unity, and a commitment to uplifting communities. Imagine the impact we can make when we combine that legacy of service with unwavering faith. When one member grows weary, another can offer encouragement. When one family faces hardship, the community can provide support. When uncertainty rises, faith can help us remain steady.

NPHC-GH Explores a Faith Matters Community Conversation on Politics and Moral Courage

On June 18, 2026, the NPHC of Greater Hartford virtually hosted its first Faith Matters Community Conversation.

The hour examined the current political climate and leadership through a faith based lens.

Moderated by Emmy award political strategist Anita Ford Saunders, Greek faith leaders presented thought-provoking and spiritually stirring perspectives on questions about racism, apathy, civil rights and more. The resounding message was we, as African-Americans in this country, have been in what felt like hopeless positions before, but through faith we have persevered. The times may change and the issues we face rearranged, but the source of hope – FAITH, remains.

Rendition of Stevie Wonder's classic song, *Love's In Need of Love Today*, was both beautiful and timely. Close to 40 were in attendance.

Feedback garnered through a launched poll at the close of the program was positive that the program met its intent to provide an open safe space to review, reflect and recommit on issues of faith that touch our community.

The Divine Nine organizations that comprise the NPHC of Greater Hartford continue to support the goal of 100% participation for Faith Matters prayer calls and community conversations. Thank you to all the fraternities and sororities for investing in this series.

What's Going On in Hartford?

National Association of Black Law Enforcement Conference October 2026

The National Association of Black Law Enforcement Officers, Inc. (NABLEO) extends an open invitation for those members of your chapter who are either current or recently retired law enforcement or criminal justice practitioners to attend our 2026 Education and Training Conference, being held at the Omni New Haven Hotel at Yale, October 21-23.

Hosted by the New Haven Guardians Association, this three (3) day program will present topics of interest designed to provide law enforcement officers with greater tools, knowledge, and skills for interacting with people, particularly in communities of color, and allow them to build operative and reciprocal bridges of understanding between law enforcement agencies and communities to create sustainable impact models of positive policing.

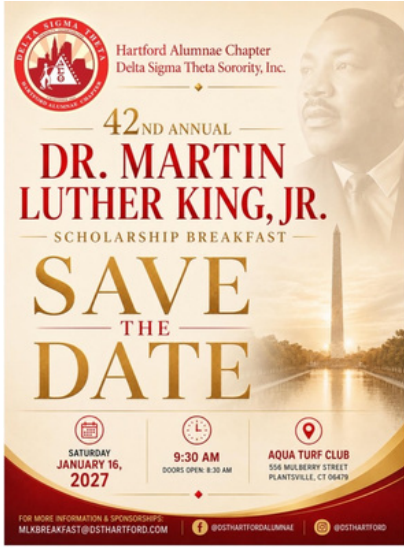

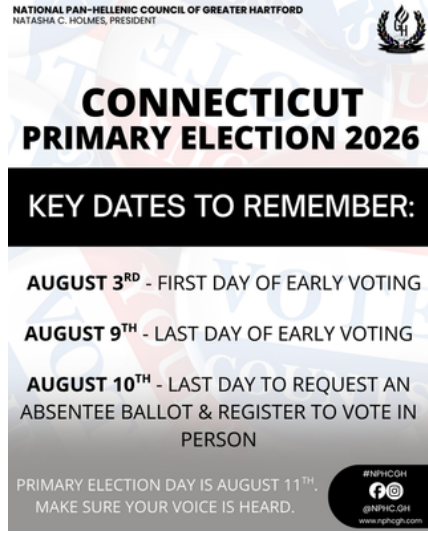
